

# CCA Meeting Minutes – November 21, 2015

The CCA General Meeting at the CCA Quonset, 11/21/15, 3:00-3:45 p.m.  
15 Carsonites present.

**Treasurer's Report:** we currently have \$2334.45. The CCA gave the Santo Niño Food Bank \$100 from the Fall Fest proceeds.

**Elections:** We needed to vote in a new president and a new board member since Art's resignation last month. Elizabeth Brownrigg was nominated and voted in as CCA President and Paul Green was voted in as a new board member through June 2017. The board members will share the job of Secretary and we hope to vote in someone permanently to that position in July 2016.

**South Carson Way & area surrounding the Quonset:** Rob Hughes spoke to Noah Hughes, who explained the road is difficult to crown due to all the rocks. What we really need is roughly \$6000 worth of material to repair the road permanently. Meanwhile, Rob made a motion that we spend up to \$900 now to put material around the building itself to solve the mud problem there. The motion passed unanimously. Then Rob said he would check prices in town and also talk with Kenny Drake. Peter Allen then reversed his vote citing that Kenny Drake is not reliable to perform or be reasonable about price. In any case, we will deal with the road issue as soon as possible, weather permitting. That would leave us with roughly \$1400 in our treasury, which is about **\$4600 shy of what we need to contend with South Carson Way. If you haven't made a tax deductible donation yet this year, now is a really good time to do so:**

**Dog problems:** Paul Green suggested we let folks know about the county's new dog ordinance, as we are having a problem with roaming dogs causing property damage in Carson. Paul will summarize the new ordinance. Dog owners need to understand they are responsible for keeping their dogs on their property. The best way to handle dog problems is to approach the owners directly to try to solve the problem before calling animal control.

**Busicks and shooting range:** The board discussed the shooting range on the Busick property. Members voiced concern about public safety with the shooters being so close to the road, and especially shooting in the direction of the Petaca. People hike

along the arroyo and lead from ammunition, which is toxic, could end up in the waterway. Todd Bledsoe suggested that first we understand the laws and ordinances that apply to the shooting range, and to shooting within a populated area. Terry, Elisabeth, and Todd will research the public safety and environmental aspects of the shooting range and report back before we decide on next steps.

**Holiday Potluck Party: will be on Saturday, December 19 at 5pm!** CCA will provide the beverages. If people would like to come around 4:00 to help set up, that would be great! Also, because we have a bonfire, feel free to bring any dead brush on your property you want to get rid of.
